#### **DISCUSSION OF RESULTS**

#### SPMT 431: Teamwork

Recommendations: The five students in the class were all seniors and worked very well together. The criteria for the Final Show and other sports shows will remain the same.

Reflections/Notes: As mentioned, the five seniors in the class did very well on the assignments and with the sports shows they produced. It was difficult because they were not able to get out in the field due to the pandemic. That included covering live high school games, conducting interviews, and broadcasting the Section 10 basketball championships. However, the students were creative in the shows they produced and used Zoom to conduct many interviews with Section 10 administrators.

#### SPMT 203 – Ethical Reasoning – Spring 2021

Summary of Findings: 75% of students will earn a C or higher on rubric for Case Study No. 5 (Penn State).

4 out of 4 students received a 2.0 or higher on Penn State Case study:

Student 1 - 2.0

Student 2 - 1.0

Student 3 - 2.0

Student 4 - 3.0

Student 5 - 3.3

Reflections/Notes: small number of students. Case study studies were difficult since they were switched from being in clase engagement case studies to individual remote case studies since three students were online and two were in the class room. Need to find a better way to manage active case studies for a flex delivery.
